# INTRODUCTION

Dear,

**Here we are, twenty-five years later...**

**In front of you is the jubilee issue of the monthly bulletin of the Youth Network in BiH and the Youth Resource Center Tuzla. The number 300 means three hundred months of continuous monthly issuance...**

**We started somewhere in May 1999, when through information of network members we tried to reach: donors, partners, other youth organizations in BiH, in the region and in the world. At the beginning, the bulletin was in dry text (then there were no graphic programs and PDFs...), and we also sent it by regular mail, since a lot of youth organizations did not even have (YES, IT SOUNDS UNBELIEVABLE, BUT THAT'S RIGHT) a reliable e-mail address. We remember those moments when our colleague Boško Vlajić "fought" with a copier in order to copy and arrange 200 copies of the bulletin, and the copier, like any device when it needed it the most, stuck, moaned, "died"....**

**Later, when email became more common, we started sending it to about 5,000 e-mail addresses in the country and abroad. Every month. And very often it happened to us that BH Telecom recognized us as spammers, because of all these bulletins, so it blocks our e-mail address. And then there were fights with them, in which we convinced them what we were doing and begged them to unblock us, so that we could continue to work. Countless times these years.**

**And here we are today, twenty-five years later. The bulletin is published regularly, in our and English and we send it to 8,000 e-mail addresses all over the world, we place it on several pages and web portals, it regularly comes out on over 10 mailing lists (with approximately 10,000 users), it is on social networks, we regularly "clutter" about 100 fb groups... Every month you have the opportunity to read us (or throw in spam 😊), share, contact us.**

**We want to thank all of you who have contributed to every issue of the bulletin in these 25 years. To everyone who sent us information, interesting news, calls... To all of you who have read and opened it. To all of you who have let us know that you regularly follow us... We hope to continue to do so... At least until the 500th. 😊**

representatives of the institutions, which they made excellent use of.

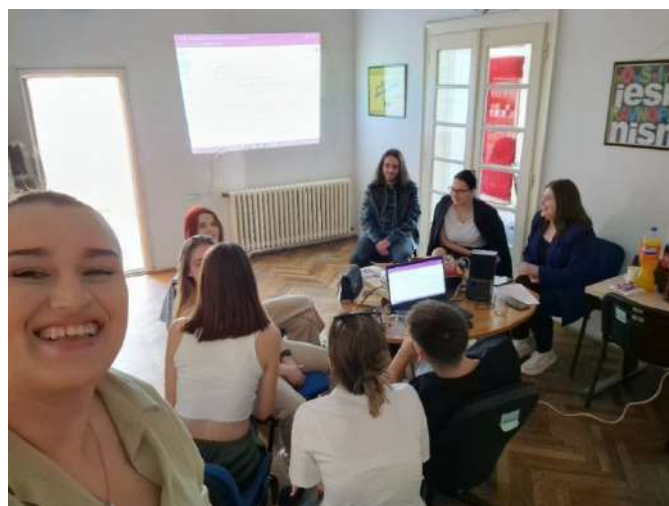
They spent the rest of the first day and the second day working in dialog groups, proposing changes to the strategy by adding problems, measures and activities.

We had the opportunity to see the exhibition of queer artists entitled "My Piece of Freedom", and the first play written by a nonbinary person "**What the Father Will Say**" by **Admir Adilović**. The festival was opened by the director of USAid in BiH **Courtney Chubb**, **Admir Adilović**, executive director of tuzla open center, director of the hbs foundation office in BiH **Paola Petrić**, representative of the smart balkans project, financed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Kingdom of Norway as well as **Asja Redžić**, representative of the City of Tuzla.

## ACTIVITIES OF MEMBERS OF THE YOUTH NETWORK OF BIH



### YOUTH ORGANIZATION "SVITAC"

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### Daily workshops

The youth organization Svitac continued with daily interactive and online activities. The younger participants did creative and age-appropriate educational things, with the help of local and international volunteers. This month they talked about insects, reptiles, tulips, bees, ladybugs and taught adjectives for opposites (small-large, low-high, broad-narrow, long-short) and the names of months and days of the week in B/H/S languages. The youngest participants enjoyed the creative part and modeling of fun objects (e.g. small rabbits made of hand prints and paper, tulips, ladybugs, bees, various figures and animals made of plasticine). The group continued with music workshops, rehearsing rhythms and songs. Participants completed learning Latin by practicing writing the letters Z and Z and started learning Cyrillic with letters A, B, V, G and D (A, B, V, G, D). They did warm-up exercises and yoga for children, and every Thursday they danced, played sports, and practiced attention and concentration by reading and listening to stories (Thumbelina, Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs, The Little Mermaid). At the English, German and Turkish language workshops, they learned words related to days of the week, months, numbers, health and adjectives. The aim of these educational activities is for children to develop their imagination and to express their creativity using various materials, and to develop motor skills, memory, a sense of tolerance and respect for others and adopt good behavior. All workshops are implemented with an educational visual method with pictures and video.



Age 13+ participated in discussions/workshops on the topics: tolerance, cultural diversity, access to knowledge, media literacy and martial arts for young people. In this way, we want to provide young people with a safe and neutral space, in which they can speak their minds.



In English and German workshops they worked on practicing grammar and everyday communication, reading and translating short texts and phrases, school homework and interesting projects.



## Guitar workshops

Within the new songs, etudes and compositions that the participants worked on are: two etudes in A minor (D. Aguado, F. Carruli), "Dao Xiang" (Jay Chou), waltz "Yacambu" (Antonio Lauro), "Knocking on a heaven's door" (Bob Dylan) and "Stella by starlight" (Victor Young).



## Samba workshops

Work continued on writing lyrics and composing melodic parts for two trombones on already existing harmonic arrangements.



## Music workshops (younger group)

The group began working on a new composition of their own (Ready Freddy). Boomwhackers were used, first as a tool for inclusion in music games, and then for working on a certain rhythmic phrase in order to develop motor skills and teamwork.



## International Day of Families

The United Nations began to deal with problems in the family in the 1980s. Since then, May 15 has been International Day of Families. Youth organization Svitic held a workshop on this topic with the youngest participants. We talked about a wide range of families, as well as the importance of feeling safe. We used a picture frame with family figures, and our volunteers also made a beautiful poster with a heart. It was very interesting to hear the opinions of our youngest and how much they love their loved ones!





## Spring Festival 2024

Youth organization Svitac held the "Spring Festival" on May 15th. An interesting music program, exhibition, "face painting" and creative stations, prepared by local and international volunteers, pleased parents and our small and big friends. Our guests listened to the compositions on guitar and violin and watched our youngest participants sing, act and dance, and a team of local and international volunteers adapted several short stories about spring, bees and flowers into small theater performances. After the program, the participants played with balloons, drew and socialized with refreshments, music and dance.



## International Day of Living Together in Peace

In its resolution 72/130, the UN General Assembly proclaimed May 16 as the International Day of Common Life in Peace as a tool for regularly mobilising the international community's efforts to promote peace, tolerance, inclusion, understanding and solidarity. We celebrated this day with the youngest participants, with whom we talked about the importance of mutual respect. The aim of this activity was to start learning the values of life in peace from an early age. Participants watched the educational video and made symbolic hearts with written words such as love, peace and tolerance. Asking simple questions to children and young people about peace and kindness can not only make them more aware of themselves; it will also make them think about the importance of being kind and true peacekeepers. To begin with, everyone should ask themselves what peace and kindness mean to them.



The discussion with the participants 15+ was conducted in English. Participants spoke about the importance of mutual understanding, respect for peace and enjoying diversity in everyday life! This was also a perfect opportunity to meet young people from Germany, Macedonia, Belgium, Scotland and Bosnia and Herzegovina of different nationalities! Living together in peace requires inclusive approaches to peacebuilding. By fostering dialogue, promoting mutual understanding and fostering cooperation, we can create a more

peaceful and harmonious world for all.



## Cultural Diversity Day for Dialogue and Development

The United Nations has declared the World Day of Cultural Diversity for dialogue and development to celebrate the richness of world cultures and the essential role of intercultural dialogue in achieving peace and sustainable development. This day was celebrated with our youngest participants. We talked about cultural differences in the customs of celebration, food and clothing. Our volunteer Eagle introduced Scotland and talked about Nessie (the loch ness monster). The youngest enjoyed the story and the presentation! We also talked about world-famous architecture such as the Eiffel Tower, the Colosseum in Rome, Big Ben in London, the Old Bridge in Mostar (BiH). The group also created a large poster with cultural diversity from around the world. We talked to 16+ participants about pop culture in the U.S. and the TV series "Friends," and how some of the less obvious meanings hidden underneath comedy are relevant to our daily lives.

For June, all activities of the Youth Organization Svitac are planned to continue.



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## The city of Cazin is dedicated to improving the position of young people

The city of Cazin is dedicated to improving the position of young people, and expresses its commitment to youth issues through the process of developing a strategy towards young people. In the past period, working groups from their thematic areas worked on identifying programs and activities that the City of Cazin implements, which are directed towards young people and mapping problems. At the new meeting of the Coordination Body and working groups, activities on the development of the strategic document continued.



The participants of the meeting were presented with the most important results from the Analysis of the position and needs of the youth of the city of Cazin, which will soon be available to the general public. The analysis served the members of working groups to get acquainted with the data related to the attitudes of young people regarding the availability of scholarships, the possibilities of practical classes, the interest of young people in opening their own businesses, housing issues, health care, availability of non-formal education and the security situation in the city area. Based on the data from the Research Analysis, the working group will work in the coming period on mapping key problems for which results and activities will be created that should lead to problem solving and creating new opportunities and opportunities for young people in Cazin. Proposals of desired results and activities will be included in the Action Plan, which will be an integral part of the youth strategy document.

According to the last census from 2013, young people make up 23.3% of the population in the city of Cazin, which makes this local self-government one of the communities with the largest share of the young population, and therefore it is of utmost importance that through the process of developing a strategy towards young people and its later implementation, the position of young people is improved through new programs and activities.

The strategy towards youth will open a new perspective in youth work and offer new opportunities and opportunities for development to the population of young people in the city in the field of employment, non-formal education, culture and sports.



## By innovating the white cane, girls from Sarajevo make it easier to move with blind and visually impaired faces

Seeking an opportunity to express their ideas and thoughts on socially beneficial changes and ways in which they can contribute to solving various problems in society, a group of hardworking young people applied to the competition in proposing social innovation – **Youth Innovation Award 2023**.

The idea that attracted the most sympathy of the public and the expert jury through the competition and won the first place was proposed by three young people from Sarajevo: **Sara Nalo, Selma Budnjo and Melisa Mutapčić**. **It's my step** is an idea thanks to which modern technology becomes a compassionate accompaniment for blind and visually impaired people. According to the available information obtained by these young innovators, there are currently over 40 million blind people in the world, while only 8% of them use a smart stick as an aid when moving. It was this data that led Sara, Selma and Melissa to offer a solution in the form of smart boxes adaptable to any white stick. How it all looks in practice you can see [HERE](#).



**For the second year in a row, the Youth Innovation Award competition is organized and implemented by the Embassy of the Kingdom of the Netherlands in BiH and the Institute for Youth Development KULT, thus providing an opportunity and support to young people to make their innovative ideas a common better future for all of us.**

They invested the award in the development of a software solution in the form of an application that is currently in the testing phase. In addition to the software part, a hardware solution of the sensor box was created, which, thanks to sensors, detects obstacles that are not exclusively on the ground, but in several levels. In order to realize the idea to the end, it is necessary that they add functionalities to the application that they have come to thanks to mentoring support.

Be My Step is a great example of how young people can significantly improve the quality of life of their fellow citizens **with their innovations**.





## Dialogue between youth and authorities dedicated to the first strategy towards the youth of the FBiH: a document that will guide the authorities and young people will be proud!

In the past period, the youth **and authorities dialogue** event was successfully completed, dedicated to creating the first youth strategy of the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina. The event brought together more than 150 participants, including FBiH Prime Minister **Nermin Nikšić**, Minister of the Federal Ministry of Culture and Sports **Sanja Vlasiavljević**, Minister of the Federal Ministry of Labour and Social Policy **Adnan Delić**, Expert Advisor in the Sector for Higher Education of the Federal Ministry of Education and Science **Sanela Kuko**, and young people from all parts of the Federation of BiH, representatives of government institutions, the international community, youth organizations and youth organizations.

This event provided a unique opportunity to exchange opinions and experiences between young people and government representatives at the federal and cantonal level, organized by the Federal Ministry of Culture and Sports, the Institute for Youth Development KULT and the Youth Council of the FBiH. Through a panel discussion and work within the thematic tables, the participants discussed key problems, needs and potential solutions for young people in the Federation of BiH.

The FBiH Youth Strategy for the period 2024-2027 will lay the foundations for future programs and activities aimed at youth. The holder of the strategy is the Federal Ministry of Culture and Sports in partnership with the Institute for Youth Development KULT and the Youth Council of the Federation of BiH.



At the end of the event, concrete conclusions and recommendations are formulated that will be integrated into the strategy and action plans. These recommendations include the areas of education, employment, health, social care, security, culture, sports and the environment as well as the participation of young people in social and political life. The dialogue once again confirmed that young people in the Federation of BiH have a lot to offer and that they are ready to actively participate in creating a better present and future for them and all other inhabitants of the Federation of BiH.



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## Girls' Day in ICT at THE INPUT Youth Center

We celebrated the Day of Girls in ICT at the INPUT Youth Center in a special way! The theme of this year's program was dedicated to girls in ICT and STEM fields. Through inspiring workshops, girls and young women had the opportunity to dive into the world of programming, 3D modeling and printing, and work with 3D pencils.



We are especially grateful to our dear teachers: **Aldina Nadžaković**, teachers of informatics from elementary school "Vladimir Nazor", and physics teachers from elementary school "Mak Dizdar". Their support and engagement are key to inspiring and encouraging young girls on their way into the world of technology and science.

This event was an opportunity for girls to get acquainted with the latest technologies and to develop skills that will help them in their future careers. The workshops were designed to encourage creativity, critical thinking and teamwork, and to give girls the confidence they need to succeed in STEM fields.

We look forward to future events and continue our mission to support girls in ICT and STEM!

## Education for CNC operators

In May, education for **CNC operator** began, organized at the Youth Center INPUT in cooperation with the **Center for Adult Education ALGEBRA KNOWLEDGE** from Travnik. This training is part of the "Labor Market Training 2024" program of the Federal Employment Service.

**CNC (Computer Numerical Control)** technology is a key component in the modern industry. Training for CNC operators provides trainees with the knowledge and skills required to operate CNC machines used in production. This education includes a theoretical and practical part, where students learn how to



Program, operate and maintain CNC machines.

This education is extremely important because it increases the employability of trainees, supports industrial development and contributes to increasing the competitiveness of companies. Qualified CNC operators are highly sought after in the labor market, and having a certificate of completed training significantly increases the chances of employment in the industrial sector.



The program **"Training for the Labor Market 2024"** of the **Federal Employment Service** aims to train unemployed people and enable them to acquire practical knowledge and skills that are needed in the labor market. Through this initiative, young people have the opportunity to acquire an education that will enable them to have a better future and a successful career.

Youth Center INPUT continues to conduct such educations, providing young people with the opportunity to develop and prepare for the labor market. We look forward to future trainings and successes of our students!



## **"NetShield" - Combating child and youth violence on the Internet**



Within the main project **"United in faith to stop violence against children and gender-based violence"**, Youth Center INPUT is implementing its mini project **"NetShield"** - combating child and youth online violence in the city of Zenica. On this occasion, the Youth Center INPUT visited the students of elementary school **"Mak Dizdar"** in order to stand together against violence against children and gender-based violence.

Hardworking students of elementary school **"Mak Dizdar"** actively participated in the conversation on this important topic, showing exceptional awareness and interest in the prevention of cyberbullying. In addition, they had the opportunity to participate in an interactive quiz, where they demonstrated their knowledge and understanding of safe online behavior.

These activities were not only educational, but also extremely useful for raising awareness of the importance of protection on the Internet. 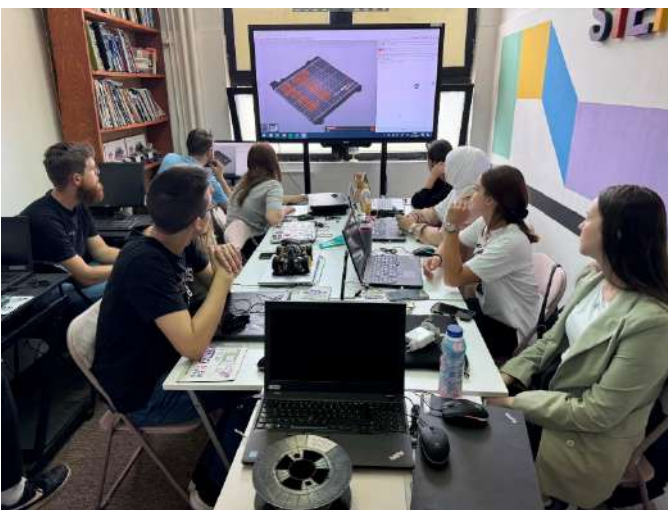

### **Internship for software engineering students at the INPUT Youth Center**

In the Youth Center INPUT, the fourth generation of practitioners, third-year students from the Polytechnic Faculty, department of software engineering, successfully implements their practice. ## 1. Call for young people from BiH: Make a short video and win prizes!

**Sarajevo Film Festival and UniCredit Bank**, the main sponsor of the Festival, are launching the project "Let's go to the Festival" with the aim of promoting and improving financial literacy among young people.

We invite all young people from all over Bosnia and Herzegovina aged **13 to 19** to do so by **June 30, 2024**. record the reel and send it to the e-mail [snimireels@sff.ba](mailto:snimireels@sff.ba), with mandatory contact information: name and surname, year of birth, contact phone and address.



Sending reels via the above e-mail is mandatory, and in addition, participants can post their reels on their social media profiles (TikTok or Instagram) with hashtags **#30thSFF #UniCreditBank #IdemoNaFestival**.

Reels needs to cover one of the given topics – card, digital payment, teen account, savings, in combination with Sarajevo Film Festival.

In order to participate in the project "Let's go to the Festival", it is necessary to meet the following requirements: reels must be an author's work, recorded on a mobile phone for a maximum

duration of up to 60 seconds; must not be registered to an earlier contest / contest / prize game or shown within another workshop or competition / contest / prize game; it must not contain, nor in any way encourage hate speech, discrimination and intolerance or violence; Music that is subject to copyright may not be used in reels. The application implies that all participants agree to the appearance in reels and its public broadcast. One participant is entitled to only one application (one reels, one author). The application implies that minor participants participate with the consent of the guardian.

The authors of the three best reels will be selected by a creative jury, and the names of the winners will be announced **on August 5, 2024**.
