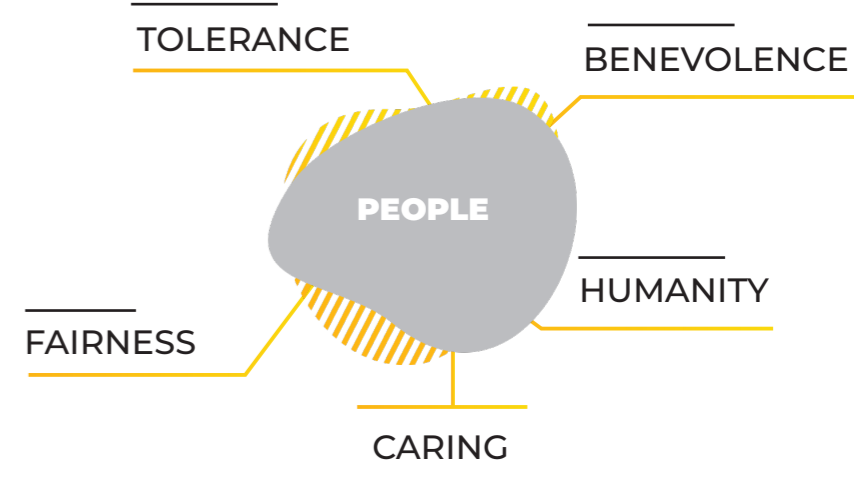
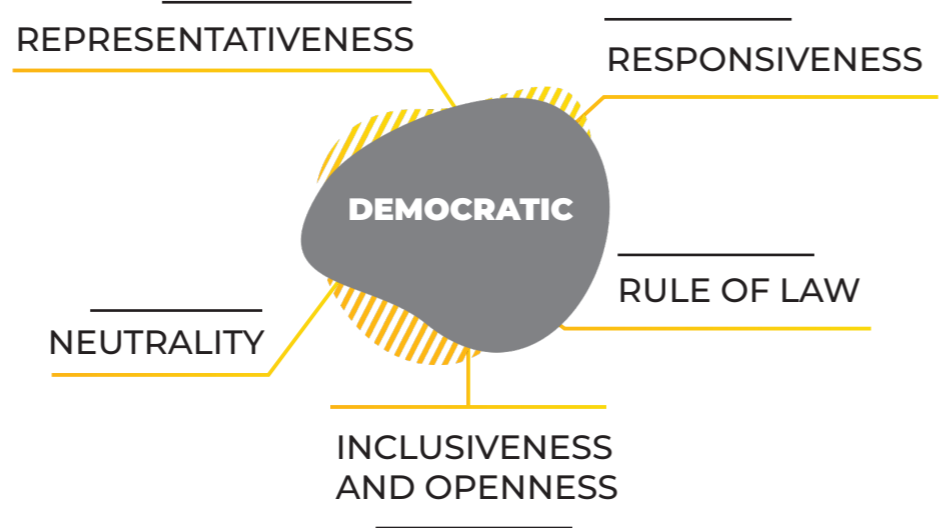
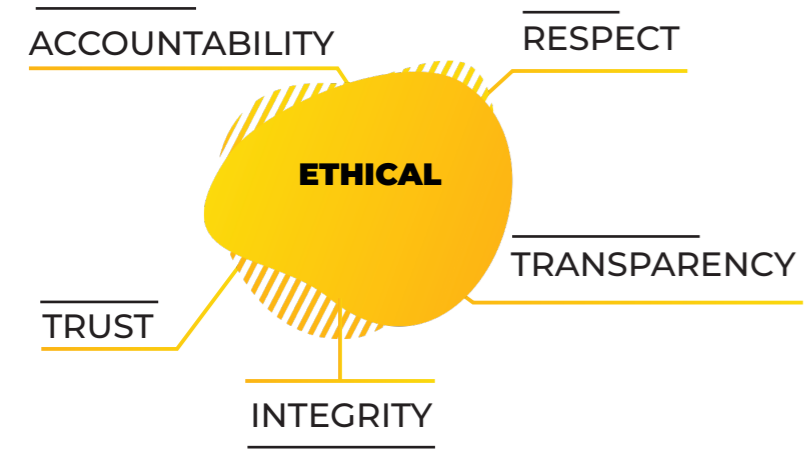
## VISION

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## PROJECTS AND INTERVENTIONS

### A- **HEALTH AND NUTRITION SECTOR** (PROJECT FUNDED BY UNICEF – 963,000 USD)

*Project title: Enhance Continuity of Health care to Children and Women in North Lebanon Under the COVID and Economic Crisis – MNCAH 2020-2021*

#### 1- OBJECTIVES:

- Improve inclusive and equitable access to quality Maternal, newborn, child and adolescent health by adopting Every Newborn Action Plan (ENAP) with continuity between community, primary and secondary healthcare services and integrated mental health services provision at the level of PHCs.
- Improve maternal, adolescent, infant, and young child nutrition, and prevention of malnutrition and increased ability to detect it.
- Strengthen the Immunization Supply Chain System for better Access to Quality Immunization Services
- Emergency response in case of extreme evictions, influx of refugees, natural disaster, outbreak or any other emergency situation

#### 2- AREA OF COVERAGE

Tripoli: Tripoli: Mina, Tebbeneh, Jabal Mohsen and Qobbe

### 3- MAIN ACTIVITIES

- Community engagement and community based preventive measures for a continuity of MNCAH and Mental health services from community to facility
- Conduct community mobilization, outreach, and referral of caregivers of children, pregnant lactating women and adolescent to benefit from the subsidized package of services at the PHCs for better follow up.
- Improved access to maternal, child and adolescent nutrition services including infant and young child feeding counselling and prevention and treatment of child malnutrition at health facility level
- Support distribution of micronutrients supplementation for U5, (including Vitamin A & iron when applicable) through the integrated IYCF program at community and PHCs level.
- Provide IYCF counselling session for Pregnant and lactating women.
- Support caregivers of children between 6 and 23 months old to receive complementary feeding with minimum dietary diversity and minimum acceptable meal frequency.
- Conduct health education for prevention, home based care and care seeking for priority maternal, newborn and childhood illness, including COVID 19

### 4- TARGETS:

- 22,550 caregivers
- 23,000 children and adolescents.

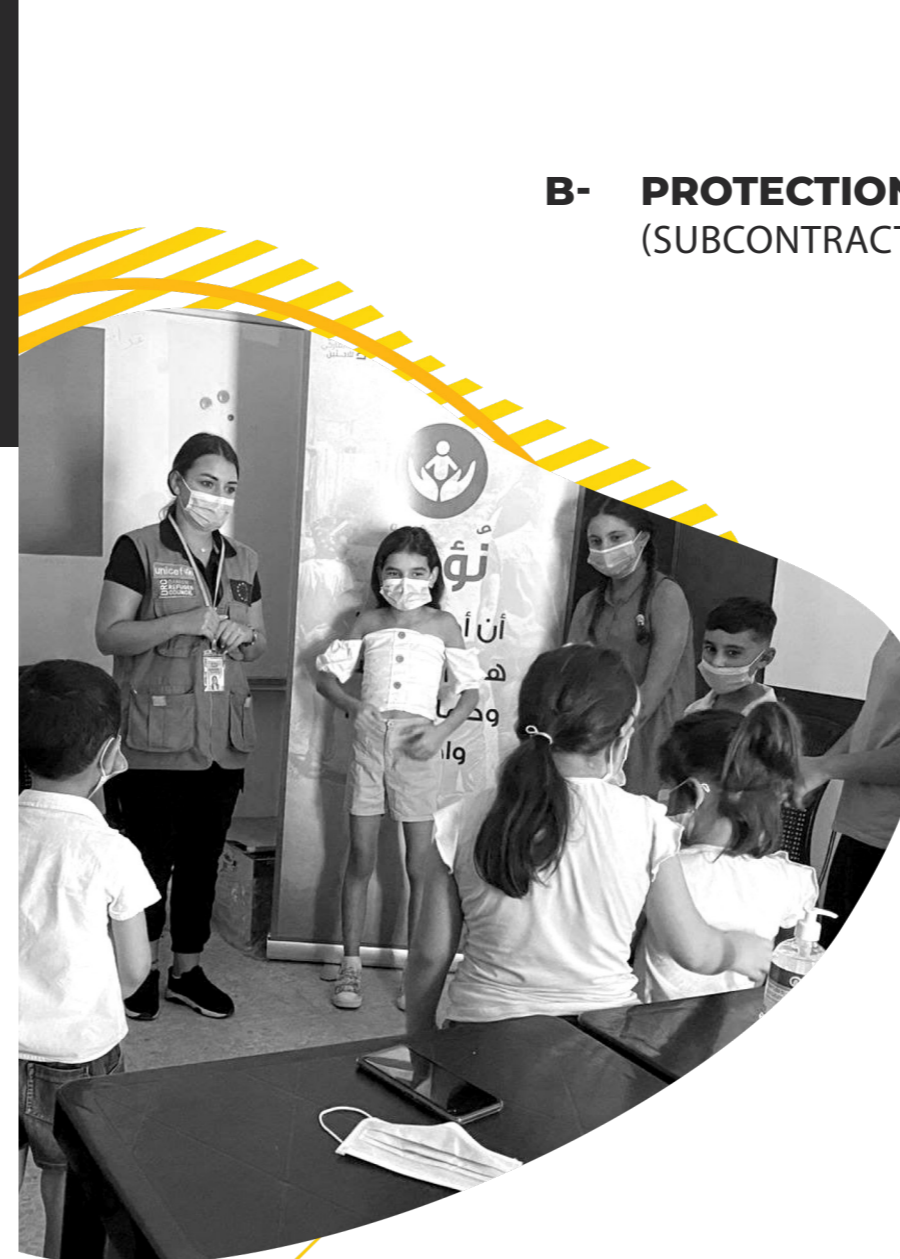
## B- PROTECTION SECTOR

(SUBCONTRACTING WITH DRC AND FUNDED BY UNICEF – 270,000 USD)

*Project title: Strengthening local capacities to deliver comprehensive child protection interventions in the North of Lebanon*

### 1- OBJECTIVES:

- Provide non judicial and judicial protection to high-risk children (in line with Government of Lebanon National Case Management Standard Operating Procedures for the Protection Juveniles (SOPs).
- Enhance interpersonal relations and self protection and increase the capacity and awareness of children to negotiate risks and know where to go for help.
- Provide caregivers with a safe space where they can exchange share positive experiences, difficulties, and doable solutions with peers whilst raising awareness about mental health and child protection, and GBV concerns or problems.
- Provide tailored psychosocial support to children at medium to high risk of CP-GBV violations which focuses on emotional support and complements the outcomes of children in case management with peer support.
- Provide information on the importance of addressing caregivers' wellbeing and protection of their children's psychosocial wellbeing.
- Provide information to boys and girls on their psychosocial wellbeing.





- Ensure that children and caregivers are receiving services with zero tolerance to sexual exploitation and abuse, through disseminating awareness sessions on PSEA.
- Enhance capacity of communities to promote child protective rights and address key CP issues

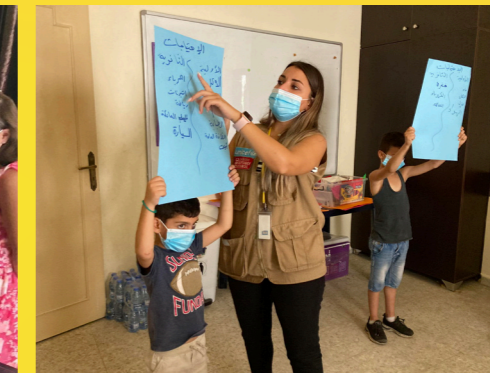

## 3- MAIN ACTIVITIES:

- Case Management,
- Community Based PSS,
- Positive Parenting,
- Focused PSS for Children (child labor, early marriage),
- FPSS for caregivers (Child labor, early marriage),
- Awareness sessions (PSEA, wellbeing).

## 4- TARGETS:

- **217 girls and boys** receiving specialized/focused PSS tackling child labor and early marriage (aged between 6 and 17)
- **150 male and female** caregivers receiving Focus PSS on Child labor and early marriage.
- **56 girls and boys** assisted through child protection case management and specialized services.
- **224 girls and boys** participating in community-based child protection activities and supported activities that mitigate protection risks for children
- **138 caregivers** engaged in activities to promote wellbeing and protection of children (Positive Parenting sessions including Qudwa toolbox).
- **500 Caregivers** and children sensitized during COVID-19 to promote their wellbeing and protection of their children.
- **2 Qudwa** initiatives conducted to prevent child marriage, child labor, and violence against children and women in communities targeting 380 participants.
- **729 children and adults** have access to a safe/accessible reporting channel to report any complaint related to violence, SEA cases, and any violation of Human/Child rights.







**C- SPORTS SECTOR**  
 (SUBCONTRACTING WITH GIZ CO-FUNDED BY THE EUROPEAN UNION  
 AND GERMANY COOPERATION - 253,000 EUROS)

*Project Title: Sports Build Generations in North Lebanon*

**1- OBJECTIVES:**

Main Objective of this project is to put the Sports for Development concept in hand of the communities mainly the youth as a tool to be used for addressing some of the challenges that arise from humanitarian crises and in conflict and post-conflict settings. Sport as a means to promote education, health, protection, development and peace, social integration and social cohesion, encourages an active lifestyle and serves as an educational tool.

**2- AREA OF COVERAGE:**

**North of Lebanon: Tripoli,  
 Minnieh-Dannieh, Bcharre,  
 Koura, Batroun and Zgharta.**



**3- MAIN ACTIVITIES:**

- First aid and COVID#19 training and awareness session for the coaches and instructors.
- Sports for Development (S4D) introduction workshop for the coaches and instructors.
- Instructor workshop for 6 coaches to become S4D instructors.
- Weekly training program targeting the indirect beneficiaries (700 - 10/group/coach) (Weekly Football trainings).
- Tournaments in different areas enhancing the interaction between communities and social cohesion.

**4- TARGETS:**

- Direct Beneficiaries:
  - **70 S4D Football coaches**, between the ages of 15-29, who will be conducting weekly training for the indirect beneficiaries.
  - **6 qualified S4D Football Instructors.**
- Indirect Beneficiaries: 700 children and youth (aged between 7 to 18 years old for male and 7 to 25 for females).
