Director's Words

Dance has long been at the forefront of the performing arts that raised awareness and nourished dreams of change and reintroduced concepts such as freedom, human dignity and justice.

But for young people in Jordan, whose talents lie in performing arts, there is often one major factor that disrupts their ability to create: a massive lack of opportunity, within the education sector, and in the process of career building.

There is nearly no coherent and consistent dance education in the country and the creative and collective nature of dance has become to be seen as invalid. Hence we are building a platform of contemporary dance in Amman for artistic presentation, exchange, and collaboration.

This is the birth of "Studio 8".

Studio 8 is a Jordanian non-for-profit performing arts theatre company. It was founded in 2014 by a group of young artists aiming to shape and humanize the dance art through innovation, experiment, development, exchange, education and research.

In the past more 10 years, Studio 8 has collaborated with more than **600** people of **43** nationalities in creating 10 original dance productions, giving more than 60 performances, and organizing more than 160 classes and workshops. Studio 8 has also made dance videos, facilitated art incubations, artistic residencies, dance inspired exhibitions, dance discussions, community art walks and street art fairs.


In 2019, Studio 8 launched an independent dance festival, IDEA – International Dance Encounter Amman (IDEA).

IDEA 2019

World class choreographers, performance directors and dance-makers join with Jordanian dance artists for a cultural celebration in Amman!

For 2019, the 1st edition of IDEA presented 9 cutting-edge dance works from home and abroad, including 46 artists coming from 18 different countries. Among them, 7 international dance performances.

IDEA 2019 also included 2 original local productions produced by Jordanian chorographers in collaboration with installation, sound, and light artists from France, Czech Republic and Iran.

It is at the heart of IDEA's mission to support, commission, and help launching the careers of local makers by creating a vibrant environment in which dance artists, choreographers, musicians, and designers collaborate to produce unique, challenging and diverse works.





IDEA 2021

Even during COVID-19, art brings us closer together than ever.

The COVID-19 pandemic has had a significant impact on the performing arts.

Despite the challenges, IDEA festival grew bigger. From September the 8th to October the 31st of 2021, 35 artists from more than 10 different countries were cocreating, performing with local artists on Jordan's stages, outdoor locations, galleries and museums, with a specific focus on inter-cultural understanding and capacity building.

For the 2nd edition of the festival, a 45-day-program was created as **a safe space** where performing artists from Jordan and abroad had access to peer support; that education on technologies is incorporated into the festival activities.

The program featured 27 events, including artistic residencies, live performances, technical theatre trainings, multidisciplinary workshops, film screenings, pop-up exhibitions, and online specials.



What are we working on?

This year marked the third edition of IDEA, a festival that prioritizes local engagement and education that creates exchange opportunities for professionals, artists, students, and researchers from around the world.

We attribute our central challenges to the following cross-cutting issues:

- Weak national cultural policy—there is currently no overarching government strategy for the arts and extremely limited funding;
- Limitations in the educational system—art was removed from the curriculum of state schools in the 1970s and dance is almost entirely absent from school curriculum;
- A lack of safe public gathering spaces for carrying out cultural activities;
- A lack of a national cultural identity; and Limited public awareness and negative perceptions—dance (outside of folk dances such as dabke) is still widely considered taboo, inappropriate, or unacceptable.

Studio 8 sees strategic capacity-building as a means of developing dance economies across Amman. Their efforts (both in-person and utilizing virtual opportunities) include:

- Developing "how-to" guides and templates for grant applications, standard contracts, artist statements, etc.;
- Improving dancers' commercial and business skills, including social media marketing;
- Provide practical "labs" for young people who are currently creating micro content, thereby offering them the possibility to develop their skills without going to university;
- Upskilling in lighting, sounds, scenography, and dramaturgy so that local performance-makers so not have to rely on specialists from outside of Jordan:
- Establishing mentorships; and
- Foster international knowledge exchange rather than only focusing on accessing international funding resources.
