Target group

The participants are young people aged **18-30** coming from **various social backgrounds**. Some are still in education (high-school or university), some are employed or self-employed (freelancers, entrepreneurs). A great deal of attention will be given to young people with **fewer opportunities**, like **NEET** cathegory (not in education, employment or training) and they will form up to 50% of the group.



Some of our projects

The goal of the **UpDatE + CV** project was to stimulate young people in a proactive way of living by involving the local community in social life to increase their chances of joining the workforce.





The goal of **#H(E+)lp** was to develop key competences for 33 young workers to provide first aid measures and interventions in case of emergency, to develop their first aid skills and teach basic techniques to young people in NGOs and to learn how to prepare and act in the event of a natural disaster.

The goal of **#BEST** was to provide information on business opportunities and funding at local, national and international for the 35 young people, to encourage entrepreneurship among young people; to introduce them to the "Business Model Canvas" on the ideas they developed; to create 7 business plans for social entrepreneurship based on the ideas of the participants plans that are underway.





eNEET Rural will focus on innovation and technology in the agricultural sector in order to create a Toolkit for young people, who are no longerin the education system, not working or being trained for work (NEETs). The Toolkit will include online and on-the-spot trainings, youth competition, staff exchange and mentoring services.
