MISSION Collateral Repair Project (CRP) is a grassroots effort to bring much-needed assistance to refugees and other victims of war and conflict—those commonly referred to as “collateral damage.” We seek to repair some of this damage and, through these efforts, foster peace and reconciliation.

CRP has been providing aid to refugees and impoverished Jordanians since 2006 and is a registered US 501(c)(3) tax-exempt non-profit organization. We offer services to people in need regardless of their background and currently provide assistance to people from many nationalities (e.g., Syria, Iraq, Sudan, Yemen, Somalia).

VALUE ADD CRP’s holistic approach first addresses refugees’ most pressing needs through our Emergency Assistance Program and then provides them with a variety of educational, recreational, and wellness activities at our vibrant Family Resource and Community Centers to gain skills, build community, and heal from trauma. Lastly, we provide community service and leadership opportunities for refugees to serve others which have proved to be a key driver of their empowerment and resilience.

CRP’s great strengths are our deep knowledge of the community we serve, commitment to community-based engagement, and ability to develop nuanced, cost-effective, and impactful programs.
