Tittle: Pame Kaimakli: Adopt an Artist

Date: July 2018

Context: Annual neighbourhood cultural festival



Urban Gorillas in collaboration with the Kaimakli residents have co-organized Pame Kaimakli festival, 2018 edition, with the theme "Adopt an Artist".

Old Kaimakli became an open gallery, and a hub of creative and social actions. Residents of Kaimakli hosted the works of local and international artists, "adopting an artist" and co-curating exhibitions, installations, and happenings in homes, shops and social spaces of the neighborhood.

Artists from the Milan-based network \underline{NON} Riservato following a residency in Nicosia have been also adopted by the local community.

Roads were closed for cars and public spaces were transformed through a series of actions, becoming a platform for discussion, culture, play and engagement.

During the festival, a series of performances, workshops, exhibitions, sound and art installations, screenings, food and music were planned, or at times occurred unexpectedly.

Urban Gorillas was the main partner of the curators as appointed by the Ministry of Culture of Cyprus to represent the Cyprus Pavilion at the Venice Biennale of Architecture. The project presented "I am where you are" focused in presenting the Freespaces present in the Cypriot cultural landscape. The project presented\ voices of resistance and challenged the globalization of the built environment. It focused on the crafting of humanitarian constructed fragments and in the augmentation of the simplicities of everyday rituals. Equally important was the presentation of the untouched and the harnessed environment and the examination of the scenography of nature and the human condition.

The Urban Gorillas team was responsible for the collection of the work of artists and architects trhough the open calls, for the communication of the projects and for the visual identity and design of the project.

Through the different forms of presentation, CCFT proposes to explore aspects of the nature of Ayios Sozomenos as a place that is redolent of complex histories: both personal and national. Related events will also take place within communities in the neighboring village of Potamia.

Title: PS:MiNi

Date: September 2017-November 2018

Urban Gorillas was funded by Tandem Europe program during a year to explore innovative approached to culture with the Milanese partner Non Riservato. UG and NR have created PS:MiNi Network, to broaden and strengthen expertise with regardsto public space (PS) innovation. PS:MiNi explored the idea of "virtual residencies" inconnection to local communities, as a way to explore global networking tools. The network connected and fostered collaboration between diverse stakeholders in Milano and Nicosia that are engaged in PS interventions and community engagement through artistic, economic, cultural and socially-engaged actions. The network discussed challenges faced in both countries such as cultural diversity, transient societies, lack of social cohesion, and the desire to foster creativecommunities. The PS:MiNi Network experimented throughout the process with "virtual" residencies adopting IoT tools to overcome geographical disparities and examine new ways of communicating "localities" while undertaking transborder spatial interventions. "Virtual" residencies will realised through the connection of artists and community members from the corresponding partner city. The project presented the work of the associated artists in two public space festivals, one in Milano, The Pxel PicNic and Pame Kaimakli in Nicosia.

Wanting to collect data about living in the city, Urban Gorillas constructed the 'Map Your City Pulse' board, where passerby's were invited to participate in this interactive and visual installation-questionnaire. By mapping their answers on the board, we were able to document how they interact with their city, what they desire from their surroundings and note the geographical residents that were eager to take part.

A few weeks later, our board travelled to the Let's Play Art in the Park contemporary arts exhibition to intermingle with other citizens and regenerate the green area.



Within the context of Maxxi museum's <u>The Independent project</u>, Urban Gorillas and co. are presenting *Urban Spectacle*, a series of public interventions exploring basic human activities in urban spaces, starting out from the relationship that is established between observer, player and spatial context and attempting to spark a new dialogue between them. The project is designed to encourage people to overcome stereotypical ways of looking at "the other" and to interact with them in public spaces.

THE INDEPENDENT is a research project focusing on the identification and promotion of independent spaces and thinking; it is the manifesto MAXXI has chosen to use to extend the confines of the museum institution, investigate the contemporary and encourage the culture "of difference".

Title: Baffle Zone

Date: January 11 2017 Context: Urban Spectacle



Urban Gorillas in collaboration with local street artist, Twenty Three, brought to life a project displayed across the buffer zone in Nicosia. 'Baffle Zone' aims not only to mirror the current circumstances of Cyprus, but also to encourage the public to personally engage in its current socio-political situation. Artist Twenty Three, paints a visual riddle, split in two, along the two sides of the green line, heartening the viewers to be interactive within the buffer zone, cross the checkpoints and map their city. In order to obtain the full wall mural and solve the riddle, one has to undertake a city stroll, transcend the physical barriers and connect the pieces. Once the image is pieced together, the visitors will be confronted with a visual maze. Under crucial socio-urban connotations and in reflection of recent reunification talks of the island, 'Baffle Zone' proposes an interaction across the divide where the spectator merges the two parts of the mural to introduce an amalgamated web.

ΦουσκόPolis [FouskoPolis] was a series of temporary architecture installations in the form of giant inflatables in public spaces all over Cyprus. Starting from workshops in Autumn 2014 to design and build the inflatables, to stepping out into underutilised public spaces and engaging the wider public in Spring 2015, ΦουσκόPolis was a grassroots initiative that was aimed at activating underutilised public spaces and challenging our perceptions and uses of public space. ΦουσκόPolis hosted a diverse programme of local and international artists and activities inside and outside the specially designed inflatables; these activities were selected after an Open Call for the community to present their own work and ideas.

Urban Gorillas worked in partnership with the Architecture Research Centre (ARC) of the University of Nicosia, Dendros Ltd. and Plastique Fantastique (Berlin) to realise this islandwide initiative. Open and free to the public ΦουσκόPolis invited the participation of the public and passers-by to get involved and experience their city from a new perspective. By experimenting with temporary inflatable architectural structures Urban Gorillas and their collaborators played with inside and outside spaces and our perceptions and use of public spaces in our cities. ΦουσκόPolis took place within the framework of the Green Urban Lab project and was made possible with funding from Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway through the EEA Grants / Norway Grants. The total grant amount received was EUR109,800 and the project cycle ran for 18 months.

ΦουσκόPolis attracted around a thousand visitors per day in each site. ΦουσκόPolis even brought people to the sites who had never visited these public spaces before. The programme of events was made up of a diverse range of actions from creative groups, collectives, artists, community organisations, other NGOs, designers and performers. There were urban games, exhibitions of photography, printmaking and architectural design work, dance, storytelling, drumming, musical workshops for young children, video installation, projections, theatre performance, yoga, capoeira, hip-hop, skateboarding, circus performances, film and documentary screenings, free hugs, a sculpture installation, a piano and other interactive installations and games as well as a mobile cafe, food from diverse minority groups living in Cyprus and a DJ closing party inside the inflatable.

Urban Gorillas in collaboration with Plastique Fantastique (Berlin) and the European Mediterranean Arts Association (EMAA) hosted Life Inside_Outside a Bubble at the Bedestan in the old city of Nicosia on 20-21 March 2015. The project was a temporary architecture installation in the form of a giant inflatable structure that hosted an artistic, cultural and community programme of events that were free and open to the public over the course of the two days. Life Inside_Outside the Bubble took place within the framework of the Green Urban Lab, made possible with funding from the EEA Grants / Norway Grants.

The European Commission and the Embassy of Italy in Cyprus hosted a lecture by Marco Canevacci, architect and founder of Plastique Fantastique on Friday 20 March at 18:30 at the Bedestan, where the giant inflatable was installed, marking the beginning of the two-day programme of events. The programme of local and international artists and activities inside and outside the specially designed, site-specific bubble was selected after an Open Call whereby interested parties were invited to present their own work and ideas. Beginning on Friday evening and continuing throughout Saturday, the programme included a diverse range of activities from dance and theatrical performances, exhibitions, video projections,

screenings, yoga and live music to a photography project building a mosaic of the city, a series of urban furniture installations, spatial and interactive installations and a mobile café.

Title: Inflating City Plaza

Following the successful workshop Inflating the Public_II led by Marco Canvacci, architect and founder of Plastique Fantastique (Berlin), Urban Gorillas inflated City Plaza in downtown Nicosia with one of their temporary structures for a couple of hours during the Pop-Up Festival on 23 November 2014.

Inflatable structures such as the one briefly installed at City Plaza are low-cost and high-impact. Ephemeral in nature, they appear in a public space and temporarily change it for the passer-by. After the installation is removed, the space remains different in the memory of the observer. This experiment was a spontaneous action as part of the Inflating the Public_2 workshop that took place within the wider framework of the Green Urban Lab (GUL) project, made possible with funding from the EEA Grants / Norway Grants.


Title: Five Installations_Five Locations_1 City

Urban Gorillas NGO in partnership with the Architecture Research Centre (ARC) of the University of Nicosia ran a pop-up event in the walled city of Nicosia following the recent workshop Inflating the Public_I, with invited guest inflatables specialist from Rome, Daniele Mancini. On 19, 20 and 21 September 2014 participants installed temporary inflatable structures at five different locations within the old part of the city. The installations were open for the public for three evenings, raising curiosity and inviting public participation with multi-sensory experiences, sound and visual installations and interactive experiences. Inflating the Public took place within the framework of the Green Urban Lab (GUL) project, which benefits from a grant from Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway through the EEA Grants and Norway Grants. "These inflatables are ephemeral spatial structures that alter our use and perception of existing spaces in the city," said Yiorgos Hadjichristou, one of the workshop leaders at the ARC. "Inflatable structures are low-cost, flexible and light, so they can pop up in urban areas effortlessly and bring new aesthetic and energy to public spaces in the city that are often underutilised, abandoned or forgotten", said Veronika Antoniou, Urban Gorillas Creative Director.

Title: Green Urban Kitchen Bus

Date: May – June 2014

Context: Temporary Urban Installation | Nicosia and Limassol

In May 2014 Urban Gorillas took a disused bus from the scrap yard and converted it into a temporary urban installation that transformed a pavement area at Ayios Antonios Park outside the old walls of Nicosia, into a shaded green space for social interaction among city dwellers. With this project we were able to promote Cypriot artistic work at street level, offer the public a creative use of public space and promote Tiganokinisi, an innovative project turning used cooking oil into biodiesel. The Green Urban Kitchen Bus was an action to raise awareness about the use of public transport and get people thinking about sustainable living, recycling, and growing our own food at home. The Green Urban Kitchen Bus was temporarily installed in Nicosia, and then in Limassol, offering shaded seating and temporary green spaces in the city. It has since been returned to the scrap yard and its future remains uncertain. The bus was inaugurated on 29 May by Dr. Costas Kadis, Minister of Education and Culture. This project was made possible by support from the Cyprus Fulbright Commission and was realised in cooperation with AKTI.

The workshop offered the opportunity to architects, students and graduates, urbanists, industrial designers, interior designers, and anyone else interested in design, public spaces and social engagement issues, to have a hands-on learning experience with one of the world's leading inflatables specialists. The structures resulting from these workshops were key features for the site-specific installations island-wide in Spring 2015.

The structure was inflated on the night of the 23rd November. at a central shopping centre n Nicosia, City Plaza, once thriving and now almost abandoned due to economic crisis.

The participants were asked to conceive, design and construct flexible inflatable structures that were later installed at various locations in Nicosia in a three-day pop-up event. The working material was polyethylene and the participants experimented with the technique of taping for its assembly. The outcome of the workshop acted as a tool in regenerating urban public spaces in Nicosia. All the materials and participation in the workshop were provided to the participants free of charge.

This workshop took place from 8 – 19 September 2014 and was the beginning of a series of workshops for the collaborative project Green Urban Laboratory (GUL) and was run by Urban Gorillas in partnership with the University of Nicosia and made possible with funding from the EEA Grants & Norway Grants. The overall project, that incorporates research and action based activities, was aimed at raising awareness on the importance of public spaces in developing socially sustainable cities through bottom-up initiatives that endorse participatory democracy.



On 9 September 2014 Urban Gorillas and the Department of Architecture of the University of Nicosia, in collaboration with the Embassy of Italy in Cyprus, hosted a lecture entitled "Unpacking Urban Fields@Cyprus" by Daniele Mancini. This lecture was held within the framework of the Green Urban Lab, which is supported by the EEA Grants / Norway Grants.

IV.Research & Publications

The research conducted at Urban Gorillas is centered on the analysis of the use, access and revitalization of public spaces in Cyprus. It is based on a wide range of research approaches: A nation-wide survey, on-site observations, interviews, focus groups and behavioural mapping methods were applied in order to carry out empirical research. Urban Gorillas' research so far reveals that public spaces in Cyprus are currently underused and underutilised, thus preparing the ground for new and innovative methods of public space designs. Through the study of the Green Urban Lab (GUL) events that took place in Cyprus in 2015, the research exposes the positive social impacts that can be gained through the means of participatory design and inclusive events. Urban Gorillas will publish in November 2016 a comprehensive presentation of the results:
